To route a cable tray into a wall-mounted box, use a compatible in-wall cable management system with proper grommets or brush openings to safely guide power and data cables.

Choosing the Right Wall-Mounted Box

Select a wall-mounted or recessed box that accommodates the number and type of cables you plan to route, including HDMI, Ethernet, USB, and power cords. Look for boxes with multiple outlets, low-voltage channels, and brush openings to reduce wear and signal interference. Ensure the box is compatible with your wall type (drywall, concrete) and your TV or device mount, and verify UL or ETL certification for safety .

Selecting a Cable Tray

Wall-mounted cable trays come in various materials such as steel, aluminum, or mesh, each offering different load capacities, corrosion resistance, and ventilation. Mesh or ventilated trays allow airflow and easy cable routing, while solid-bottom trays provide extra protection against dust or electromagnetic interference . Choose a tray that fits the depth and width of your wall cavity and can support the weight of your cables.

Installation Steps

- o Plan the Route: Measure the distance from the cable tray to the wall-mounted box and mark the path. Ensure the tray aligns with the box's entry points or grommets.
- o Prepare the Wall: Cut an opening in the wall using templates provided with the in-wall box or cable management kit. Maintain at least 2.8 inches of depth for most in-wall kits .
- o Mount the Tray: Secure the cable tray along the wall using brackets or mounting wings. Ensure it is level and firmly attached to prevent sagging.
- o Feed Cables: Route cables through the tray into the wall-mounted box, using brush openings or grommets to protect cables from sharp edges and reduce signal interference.
- o Secure Connections: Inside the box, organize cables neatly, connecting them to outlets, AV devices, or power modules. Use cable ties or clips to prevent tangling.
- o Finish Installation: Attach the faceplate or cover to the wall-mounted box for a flush, clean appearance. Verify that all cables are accessible for future upgrades .

Safety and Compliance

- o Use UL or ETL-certified boxes and trays for in-wall installations.
- o Avoid overloading the tray with too many cables to prevent overheating.
- o Ensure proper grounding and separation of power and data cables to reduce interference.
- o Follow local electrical codes for in-wall power connections . By carefully selecting compatible components
