Cable trays are commonly available in widths from 50mm to 900mm, depths from 50mm to 150mm, and lengths of 2.5m to 6m, depending on type and application.

Standard Widths and Depths

Cable tray widths are the primary factor in determining cable capacity. Common nominal inside widths include 50mm, 100mm, 150mm, 200mm, 300mm, 400mm, 500mm, 600mm, 750mm, and 900mm, with the outside width slightly larger due to side rail thickness. Depths, often referred to as side rail height, typically range from 50mm to 150mm, controlling vertical stacking capacity and ensuring proper heat dissipation.

Standard Lengths

Most cable trays are manufactured in 3-meter (10-foot) segments, though lengths of 2.5m and 6m are also common depending on regional standards and manufacturer specifications. These lengths balance ease of transport with installation efficiency.

Tray Types and Size Considerations

Different tray types influence sizing choices:

- o Ladder Cable Tray: Open design with side rails and rungs, ideal for heavy-duty cables and long runs. Widths and depths follow standard ranges to support ventilation and load.
- o Perforated Cable Tray: Flat bottom with ventilation holes, suitable for moderate cable loads. Standard widths and depths are similar to ladder trays but allow better airflow.
- o Solid-Bottom Cable Tray: Fully enclosed, used for sensitive cables like fiber optics. Depths may be slightly larger to accommodate cable protection.
- o Wire Mesh (Basket) Tray: Flexible routing for light to medium loads, often in smaller widths (100-400mm) and shallower depths (50-100mm).

Sizing Guidelines

- o Cable Fill: Trays should be filled to no more than 40% of their capacity to allow airflow and prevent overheating.
- o Future Expansion: Consider potential cable additions when selecting width and depth to avoid costly retrofits.
- o Load Class: Ensure the tray's load rating matches the total cable weight and support span. By selecting the correct width, depth, and type, cable trays can provide safe, code-compliant, and expandable cable
