

Distribution Box Piece-Based Payment Scheme

Overview

Application in Payment Services

In the context of payment service providers (PSPs) and distribution partnerships, piece-based schemes can be applied to incentivize third-party partners or agents to process more transactions or expand reach. For example:

- o Transaction Volume Incentives: Partners may earn a fee for each payment transaction processed through their network, encouraging higher transaction volumes .
- o Embedded Payment Solutions: Non-PSPs integrating payment services into their platforms can receive revenue based on the number of transactions completed, effectively a piece-based model .
- o Co-branded Services: Banks and retailers offering co-branded cards or payment solutions can structure compensation based on the number of accounts opened or transactions made .

- o Scalability: Easily applied across multiple distribution channels or partners.
- o Revenue Alignment: Ensures that payments are proportional to the value generated, particularly in

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transaction-based services .

- o Risk Management: In financial services, schemes should consider credit, operational, and liquidity risks associated with transaction volumes .
