

How to install overlapping elbows on cable trays

Article Overview

Overlapping elbows on cable trays are installed by aligning the elbow with the tray run, overlapping the ends, securing with appropriate connectors, and ensuring proper support spacing to maintain structural integrity and cable protection.

Step-by-Step Installation

1. Plan the Route and Elbow Placement Before installation, mark the cable tray route and identify where elbows are required. Consider the bend radius of cables to prevent damage and ensure smooth cable transitions. Overlapping elbows are typically used to maintain continuous support and avoid gaps in the tray system . 2. Align the Elbow with the Tray Position the elbow so that it overlaps the end of the straight tray section. The overlap should be sufficient to allow secure fastening, usually covering at least one rung or flange of the tray. Ensure the elbow is oriented correctly for the intended cable path. 3. Secure the Elbow Use the manufacturer-recommended connectors, bolts, or clamps to fasten the overlapping sections. Tighten all fasteners evenly to prevent misalignment. For ladder-type trays, ensure rungs are aligned to maintain cable support. For solid or perforated trays, align the tray edges to avoid gaps that could compromise cable protection . 4. Support the Elbow Properly Install hangers or brackets near the elbow to support the weight of the tray and cables. Maintain the recommended support spacing, typically 1.5 to 3 meters depending on tray type and load. Additional support may be required at the elbow due to the change in direction and potential stress points . 5. Check Clearance and Bend Radius Verify that the elbow provides adequate clearance for cables and that the bend radius meets cable manufacturer specifications. Avoid sharp bends that could damage insulation or reduce cable lifespan . 6. Inspect and Adjust After installation, inspect the elbow for alignment, secure fastening, and proper support. Adjust as necessary to ensure a smooth, continuous path for cables and compliance with safety standards.

- o Use cable tray rollers for long runs to ease cable installation.
- o Ensure elbows are compatible with the tray type (ladder, perforated, solid-bottom).
