

# How to lay pre-terminated butterfly-shaped optical cables

## Article Overview

Pre-terminated butterfly-shaped optical cables should be installed by carefully planning the route, maintaining proper bend radius, securing the flat ribbon cable, and connecting the pre-terminated ends to compatible patch panels or devices.

## Planning and Preparation

Before installation, map out the cable pathways along walls, ceilings, raised floors, or conduits, ensuring they are free of obstacles and sharp edges that could damage the cable . Determine the required cable length and include extra slack for future reconfigurations or maintenance. Identify the type of fiber (single-mode or multimode) and connector type (MPO, LC, SC) to ensure compatibility with network equipment .

## Handling and Routing

Butterfly-shaped cables, also known as ribbon fiber cables, have a flat profile with multiple fibers in a single ribbon, reinforced by strength members . Handle the cable gently to avoid twisting or rolling, which can damage fibers. Maintain the minimum bend radius specified by the manufacturer, typically larger than the cable width, to prevent signal loss or fiber breakage . Use cable guides, trays, or clips to secure the cable along the route without applying excessive pressure.

## Installation Steps

- o Uncoil Carefully: Remove the cable from the drum or box slowly, avoiding kinks or sharp bends .
- o Route the Cable: Lay the cable along the planned path, securing it at regular intervals with cable ties or clips, ensuring the flat side remains oriented correctly .
- o Slack Management: Leave sufficient slack at both ends for termination, testing, and future adjustments .
- o Protective Measures: Use conduit, raceways, or protective tubing in areas prone to mechanical stress or environmental exposure .
- o Connect Pre-Terminated Ends: Plug the pre-terminated connectors into patch panels, distribution frames, or optical devices. Ensure connectors are clean and free of dust using fiber cleaning tools .

## Testing and Verification

After installation, perform optical testing to verify signal integrity, including insertion loss and continuity checks. Document the cable routes, connector types, and test results for future maintenance .

- o Keep the flat ribbon orientation consistent to simplify future splicing or troubleshooting.
- o Use LSZH or PVC jackets as appropriate for indoor or outdoor environments .
