

How to organize the cable management rack in the low-voltage box

Planning and Layout

 - o Ensure airflow is not obstructed to prevent overheating of PoE switches and other low-voltage equipment .
 - o Test all connections after installation and maintain a future-ready layout for upgrades or troubleshooting .
