

How to suspend cables inside a cable tray

Cables inside a cable tray should be suspended using appropriate supports, clamps, or tie mounts to prevent mechanical strain, maintain organization, and comply with safety standards.

Selecting the Right Support Method

Maintaining Proper Support and Strain Relief

Cables must be supported at appropriate intervals to prevent damage from their own weight or mechanical strain. The spacing depends on cable type, diameter, and weight. For vertical runs, strain relief sections should be incorporated, offsetting the cable by at least two cable diameters per section. Excessive vertical runs (over 100 meters) require additional tension-relieving measures .

- o Ensure all supports and accessories are fire-resistant and suitable for the cable type .
- o Avoid using cable trays as walkways or for supporting personnel, as this can damage cables and compromise safety .
- o Follow standards such as BS EN 61537 for cable tray systems and BS 6946 for channel supports .
