

How to tie cables in a vertical shaft cable tray

In vertical cable tray installations, cables must be securely tied to the tray at regular intervals using appropriate cable ties to maintain spacing, prevent sagging, and comply with electrical codes.

Key Guidelines for Vertical Cable Tray Cable Tying

1. Secure Cables to Transverse Members For vertical runs, the National Electrical Code (NEC) Section 392.8(B) requires that cables be fastened securely to the transverse members of the cable tray. Unlike horizontal runs, where the cable weight alone can keep them in place, vertical cables can hang away from the tray if not tied down, potentially causing damage or misalignment . 2. Tie Frequency

- o Small-diameter, flexible cables: These tend to hang further from the tray and should be tied more frequently.
- o Large-diameter, stiff cables: These require less frequent ties but still need secure attachment.
- o General recommendation: Tie cables at intervals that prevent sagging and maintain proper spacing. For example, MI cables with fire-resistant ratings should be tied every three feet using stainless steel ties . 3. Cable Tie Selection

- o Use ties with sufficient strength and durability for the cable type and environment.
- o Stainless steel ties are preferred for heavy or fire-rated cables.
- o Ensure ties maintain spacing between cables, which can improve ampacity and prevent overheating . 4. Maintain Proper Spacing

- o Keep a minimum spacing of one cable diameter between cables in single-layer, uncovered trays to allow heat dissipation and higher ampacity ratings .
- o Cable ties help maintain this spacing and prevent cables from touching or crossing improperly. 5. Installation Tips

- o Position ties so that cables are centered and balanced in the tray.
- o Avoid over-tightening, which can damage cable insulation.
- o For long vertical runs, consider pre-formed or continuous cable ties to reduce installation time and improve consistency .

- o Ensure that the tray and tie system can withstand forces generated during short circuits or abnormal conditions . 6. Special Considerations

- o When mixing low-energy signal cables and power cables, tie-downs or permanent barriers may be used to maintain separation.
 - o For ventilated channel trays, secure cables to both horizontal and vertical surfaces to prevent displacement .
- By following these practices, vertical cable tray installations will be safe, code-compliant, and organized, reducing the risk of cable damage and improving system reliability.
