

How to wire the power interface of the distribution box

Wiring a distribution box involves connecting the main power supply to the main terminal, arranging circuit breakers, and safely distributing electricity to branch circuits while following proper color coding and safety standards.

Step 1: Safety First

Step 3: Wire Color Coding

Follow standard color codes for safety and clarity:

- o Neutral wire: Blue
- o Phase wires: A-phase yellow, B-phase green, C-phase red
- o Ground wire: Green/yellow striped

Step 4: Connect the Main Power

Attach the incoming live wire (brown or red) to the main terminal of the distribution box. Connect the neutral and ground wires to their respective bus bars. This is the first and most critical connection .

Step 5: Install and Connect Circuit Breakers

- o Position the circuit breakers in the designated slots, usually arranged left to right, with reserved positions on the right .
- o Connect each branch circuit wire to its corresponding breaker. For easier wiring, you can use parallel connections for multiple circuits .
- o Ensure wiring between the main breaker and branch breakers generally runs on the left, and outgoing



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circuits exit on the right .

Step 6: Organize and Secure Wires

- o Use plastic ties to bind wires neatly, keeping spacing uniform and wires straight .
- o Clearly label each circuit for identification and safety.
- o Mark different voltage levels (AC, DC) if applicable .

Step 7: Testing and Inspection

- o After wiring, use a multimeter to verify all connections are secure and there are no short circuits .
- o Perform a safety inspection to check for potential overloads, loose connections, or inadequate insulation .
- o Only after confirming safety should the main power be turned on.

Step 8: Compliance and Maintenance

- o Follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC, or regional standards) and use UL/CE-certified components .
