

Installation of Cable Tray Suspension Brackets

Cable tray suspension brackets are installed using ceiling-mounted trapeze or C-hanger systems, ensuring proper spacing, leveling, and secure attachment to support the tray and cables safely.

Tools and Materials

- o Cut and Prepare Trays: Measure the required tray lengths, cut with a hacksaw or angle grinder, and deburr edges to prevent cable damage .
- o Place and Secure Trays: Lift tray sections onto the support channels. Fasten trays using hold-down clips or bolts to prevent sliding. Join sections end-to-end with couplers or splice plates .
- o Check Spacing and Load: Standard support spacing is typically 1.5-2 meters, but always follow manufacturer specifications. Maximum load per hanger varies by system, often around 318-340 kg .
- o Grounding: Ensure proper grounding of the tray system according to local electrical codes .

Best Practices

- o Use components designed and tested together as a system for safety and reliability .
- o Ensure all supports are level and aligned to prevent stress on trays and cables .
- o Avoid using trays as walkways or for supporting personnel .
- o Store trays on dunnage to prevent damage before installation .
- o Select materials (galvanized, stainless steel, PVC-coated) based on environmental conditions and corrosion resistance . Following these steps ensures a safe, durable, and code-compliant cable tray suspension system suitable for industrial or commercial installations.
