Typical Price Ranges

- o Single-mode fiber (OS1/OS2): \$0.30 to \$2.80 per meter (\$0.09-\$0.85 per foot) for standard bulk purchases. Single-mode cables are ideal for long-distance transmission and are generally less expensive per foot than multimode fiber, though the equipment required is costlier .

Factors Affecting Pricing

- o Fiber Count and Cable Construction: More cores increase material costs. Loose-tube, tight-buffered, and armored constructions also affect price .
- o Jacket Material and Environmental Rating: Indoor PVC or LSZH jackets are cheaper, while outdoor PE or UV-resistant jackets cost more .
- o Installation Complexity: Underground or aerial installations, trenching, and conduit requirements add \$2-\$6 per foot to total project costs .
- o Connectorization and Pre-Termination: Factory-terminated patch cables and assemblies are more expensive than raw cable .
- o Volume Discounts: Bulk purchases can reduce per-foot costs by 20-40% compared to retail quantities .
