

Slotting of 24-position distribution box

Article Overview

A 24-position distribution box can be organized using modular trays for splicing, patching, and splitter integration, with clear allocation for incoming and outgoing fibers or cables.

Modular Organization

For fiber optic distribution boxes like the MDB-M24, the box is designed to handle up to 24 SC positions. The central area is used for fiber management, protected by a front door, and allows for:

- o Patch Modules: Can accommodate up to two SC pre-terminated cables for direct patching .
- o Splice Modules: Can splice up to 24 fibers from one or two incoming cables to pigtails connected to the patch panel .
- o Splitter Modules: Can house six 1x4 or three 1x8 SC/APC PLC splitters, with input fibers spliced to incoming cables . The top and bottom walls of the module are removable to facilitate patching between stacked modules, allowing flexible slotting and fiber routing.

Cable Entry and Exit

- o Cable Entry Ports: Typically, two entry points are provided for incoming cables, maintaining neat routing and strain relief .
- o Patch Cord Exit Points: 24 exit points allow organized connection to end devices or network equipment .
- o Locking and Protection: Covers are secured with a key lock (e.g., 8mm triangular key) to prevent unauthorized access and maintain IP55-IP65 protection for indoor or outdoor use .

Slotting Best Practices

- o Segregate Functions: Assign specific trays or slots for splicing, patching, and splitters to avoid congestion and simplify maintenance.
- o Labeling: Clearly label each port and fiber to ensure easy identification and troubleshooting.
- o Fiber Management: Use the central area for routing fibers with minimal bending radius to prevent signal loss.
- o Modular Expansion: Stack additional modules (e.g., MDB-M48) if more than 24 positions are required, maintaining consistent slotting logic .
- o Indoor vs Outdoor: Ensure the box rating (IP55/IP65) matches the installation environment, and use appropriate sealing for cable entries .

RJ45 Area Distribution Boxes

For network cabling with RJ45 connectors, 24-position boxes can be equipped with Cat. 5e, Cat. 6, or Cat. 6A

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patching connectors. Slotting involves:

- o Fixing the box on floors, partitions, ceilings, or cable trays.
- o Pre-terminating cables to minimize field work.
- o Maintaining a minimum distance from patch panels to comply with channel length limitations .
