

Standard Dimensions of Distribution Box Housings

Article Overview

Distribution box housings come in a wide range of sizes, from compact 1-way units to large freestanding cabinets accommodating 36 or more circuits.

Wall-Mounted Distribution Boxes

Wall-mounted distribution boxes are commonly used in residential and light commercial applications. Typical dimensions range from 200 x 200 x 120 mm up to 800 x 600 x 300 mm depending on the number of ways and internal layout requirements . These boxes are designed to house MCBs, RCDs, RCBOs, busbars, neutral and earth bars, and sometimes surge protective devices . Compact plastic or FRP boxes are often used for light-duty applications, offering IP55 to IP66 protection for indoor or outdoor use .

Freestanding or Floor-Standing Cabinets

Freestanding distribution cabinets are used in industrial or large commercial installations. They typically range from 1600-2200 mm in height, 600-1800 mm in width, and 300-600 mm in depth . These enclosures provide ample space for larger back panels, multiple busbars, and complex wiring layouts. They are suitable for medium-voltage panels, control systems, or multi-circuit distribution setups .

Number of Ways and Modular Sizes

Distribution boxes are often categorized by the number of ways (circuits) they can accommodate. Common ranges include 1-way to 36-way boxes, with standard models like TOP-TS, TOP-TF, TOP-LS, TOP-PS, TOP-PF, and TOP-S series . The size of the enclosure generally increases with the number of ways to ensure sufficient space for wiring, heat dissipation, and future expansion .

Material and Mounting Considerations

Distribution boxes can be made from metal, plastic, or FRP, depending on environmental conditions and application requirements . Wall-mounted boxes are typically lighter and easier to install, while freestanding cabinets offer greater rigidity and protection for heavy-duty industrial use. Depth is an important factor, as deeper boxes allow more wiring space and reduce the risk of overheating .
