- o Voltage and Phase Information: Labels may indicate voltage levels, phase (L1, L2, L3), and neutral or ground connections to prevent miswiring .
- o Safety Warnings: High-voltage or hazardous terminals are marked with caution symbols or color-coded labels to alert personnel .

Label Types and Materials

- o Vinyl or Plastic Stickers: Durable, easy-to-read labels for indoor use, often color-coded for different circuits .
- o Engraved or Laminated Tags: Used in industrial or outdoor environments for long-lasting identification .
- o QR Code Labels: Modern systems may include QR codes linking to wiring diagrams or maintenance records for quick reference .

Standards and Guidelines

- o IEC 61439: Specifies requirements for low-voltage distribution boards, including labeling, separation of live parts, and safety measures .
- o Form of Separation: Labels help indicate which terminals are isolated or grouped according to safety forms (Form 1-Form 4), critical in industrial or hospital installations .

- o Keep labels legible and consistent with wiring diagrams.
- o Use color coding to differentiate phases, neutral, and ground.
- o Update labels whenever circuits are modified or added.
- o Place labels close to the corresponding terminal or breaker for easy identification.
- o Ensure labels are resistant to heat, moisture, and abrasion in industrial environments.
