A control box is not the same as a distribution box; while a distribution box divides and protects electrical power, a control box manages and regulates the operation of electrical equipment.

Distribution Box

A distribution box, also called a distribution board or panel, is primarily designed to distribute incoming electrical power to multiple circuits safely and efficiently. It houses protective devices such as circuit breakers, fuses, and residual current devices (RCDs) to prevent overloads, short circuits, and earth faults, ensuring both equipment and personnel safety . Distribution boxes are typically wall-mounted or embedded, handle low current, and are relatively simple in structure, acting as a "splitter" to send power to lighting, sockets, or small equipment . They are commonly used in homes, schools, hospitals, and small industrial setups.

Control Box

A control box, on the other hand, is designed to control, monitor, and automate electrical equipment rather than just distribute power. It contains components such as contactors, relays, PLCs (Programmable Logic Controllers), switches, and sensors . Control boxes execute logical sequences like starting or stopping motors, regulating pump speeds, or responding to sensor inputs. They are widely used in industrial automation, factories, HVAC systems, fire pumps, and other machinery control applications . Control boxes can also provide fault signaling, preventive maintenance alerts, and emergency stop functions, ensuring safe and efficient operation of connected equipment.
