

The ground wire of the distribution box should be a flexible wire

The ground wire in a distribution box should be a flexible, yellow-green insulated copper wire to ensure reliable grounding and ease of connection.

Wire Type and Flexibility

For distribution boxes, the grounding wire is typically a flexible copper conductor. Flexibility is important because it allows the wire to be routed easily within the enclosure, accommodates vibrations or minor movements, and ensures a secure connection to the grounding bar or PE terminal without stress on the wire (). Rigid wires can be difficult to manage and may loosen over time, compromising safety.

Insulation and Color Coding

The grounding wire should have yellow-green insulation, which serves as a clear visual indicator for maintenance and inspection (). This color coding is standard in most electrical codes and helps prevent accidental misconnection with live conductors.

Material and Conductivity

Copper is the preferred material for grounding wires due to its excellent conductivity and corrosion resistance (). Aluminum is generally avoided for grounding in distribution boxes because it corrodes over time, which can increase resistance and reduce the effectiveness of the grounding system.

Sizing and Code Compliance

The cross-sectional area of the grounding wire must meet or exceed the minimum specified by electrical codes such as the NEC, based on the circuit's overcurrent protection (). Proper sizing ensures that the wire can safely carry fault currents to trip protective devices, preventing electric shock or fire hazards.

Installation Tips

- o Connect the flexible ground wire securely to the PE bar or grounding terminal inside the distribution box ().
- o Strip the wire appropriately and tighten the terminal screw to avoid loose connections.
- o Ensure all metallic components that require grounding are connected to the PE bar.
- o Clearly mark the grounding wire for easy inspection and maintenance (). Using a flexible, properly sized, yellow-green copper wire ensures that the distribution box grounding system is safe, reliable, and compliant with electrical standards.
