- o Avoid DIY fixes for major damage: If the burning involves main service wiring or extensive insulation damage, do not attempt repairs yourself .

Repair and Replacement

- o Replace damaged wires and components: Use wires of the same gauge and insulation type, and ensure all splices are in approved junction boxes .
- o Check and replace faulty breakers: Any defective or burnt breakers should be replaced by a licensed

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electrician .

- o Ensure proper connections: Tighten all terminals and secure wires to prevent future overheating .

Prevention

- o Schedule regular electrical inspections every 10 years or after major modifications .

- o Avoid overloading circuits and ensure appliances are distributed across multiple breakers .

- o Keep the distribution box clean, dry, and free from dust or debris .

- o Replace aging panels or wiring proactively to prevent failures .
