- o Apply silicone sealant around the edges of the box cover and cable entry points to enhance waterproofing .
- o Install a weatherproof cover designed for outdoor use, ensuring it is securely attached and angled slightly downward to promote water runoff .

5. Use Outdoor-Rated Components

- o Install outdoor-rated outlets and switches with rubber gaskets and protective covers .
- o Consider GFCI outlets for additional safety in wet environments .

6. Moisture Management and Maintenance

- o Inspect seals, gaskets, and cable entries regularly, especially after heavy rain or high humidity .

- o Use hydrophobic vents or desiccant packs to reduce condensation inside the box .
- o Replace worn or damaged parts promptly to maintain a tight seal .
