Safety Warnings: Include warnings such as "Danger: High Voltage" or "Warning: Authorized Personnel Only" to alert users to potential hazards . 6. Emergency Contact Information: Provide a phone number or contact for emergencies, enabling quick response in case of electrical incidents . 7. Special Devices: If surge protection devices (SPDs) or other safety equipment are installed downstream, their presence should be indicated on or near the panel, along with periodic check reminders .

Best Practices for Labeling

- o Durable Materials: Use vinyl, polyester, or industrial-grade labels that resist fading, moisture, and wear .
- o Legibility: Ensure labels are clear, with large, contrasting fonts, and placed where they are easily visible .
- o Consistency: Use standardized abbreviations like "A/C" for air conditioner or "GFCI" for Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter .
- o Regular Updates: Check and update labels whenever circuits are added, modified, or rerouted .
- o Professional Assistance: If unsure, consult a licensed electrician to ensure compliance with local codes and safety standards . Proper labeling not only enhances safety and compliance with regulations such as the NEC and Wiring Regulations but also improves efficiency during maintenance, troubleshooting, and emergency situations .
